

Level 3 Values Worksheet Instructions

Oxford Discover encourages young learners to look at big questions, think critically, and communicate effectively. The Oxford Discover Values Worksheets connect content from the course with personal and social development topics. Teaching values increases children's awareness of good behavior and helps them to understand how their behavior and attitudes affect others. These worksheets are meant to be used after the students have completed each two-unit Big Question section. The activities use language and concepts from each section.

Values Worksheet 1: Learn About Other Cultures

A Remind students that they read about having fun in different cultures in *Having Fun*, pages 10–11. In this activity, students look closely at the picture of a family reunion. Then students circle the words that complete each sentence.

Answer Key:

B Students think about the things they do with their families during a family reunion. Then they write their answers on the lines and share their work with a partner.

Values Worksheet 2: Try New Things

A Remind students that they read about people moving to try new experiences in *Moving from Here... to There!* pages 38–39. In this activity, students look at the picture and read the words in the box. Then they read each sentence and write the word to complete the sentence.

B Students read the dialogue. Then they write two additional sentences to complete the dialogue. Lastly, students read and act out the dialogue with a partner.

A Remind students that they read about being creative with different kinds of poems in *You Can Be a Poet* pages 58–59. In this activity, students look at the picture. Then they read the dialogue and add the correct words to complete each sentence.
